The Basics of Direct Secure Messaging

What is Direct Secure Messaging (DSM)?

- Direct is a technical standard for exchanging health information between health care entities in a trusted network.
- It is secure, easy-to-use, inexpensive, and approved for use by nationally recognized experts and organizations.
- Direct functions like regular e-mail with additional security measures to ensure that messages are only accessible to the intended recipient, per the protection regulations of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA).

Examples of documents that can be sent via DSM include:

- Continuity of Care Documents (CCDs)
- Referral Documents
- Test Results
- Patient Encounter Notes
- Medications and Allergies

What is a HISP?

 A Health Information Service Provider, or HISP, is an accredited network service operator that enables nationwide clinical data exchange using DSM. NDHIN is considered a HISP and offers DSM to all participants at no additional cost with unlimited users.

What is DirectTrust?

- HISPs and Direct are regulated and monitored by the DirectTrust.org
