The connection between the Joint Health Information Exchange (JHIE) and NDHIN is LIVE!

- This connection utilizes the eHealth Exchange framework, and provides Department of Defense (DoD), Department of Veteran Affairs (VA), and private partners the opportunity to exchange patient information
- NDHIN participating healthcare providers can now securely query a patient's medical history from both DoD and VA facilities
- NDHIN participants can initiate a query of the JHIE through the External Record tab of the patient's record in the NDHIN clinical portal

NEW Module in NDHIN for Newborn Screening NDHIN recently teamed up with the North Dakota Newborn Screening (NBS) Program to launch a new module within NDHIN that supports their long term follow up services for children diagnosed with genetic and metabolic disorders.

- The module contains a pathway that tracks children through age 6 Children are enrolled in a pathway once a test result is confirmed
- An initial assessment is done that collects information on the following,
 - Nutrition
 - Interventions
 - DME
 - Developmental milestones
 - Barriers to receiving care
- Follow up visits and information collected at each visit are based on the child's age
- The focus of long term follow up services is to ensure that families are:
 - Getting needed support and are
 - Connected to community services
- The NBS module also includes;
 - Care planning tool
 - Problem list
 - Expanded use of Circle of Care
- Although this module is currently only accessed by the NBS team, ALL NDHIN users
 can find completed assessments and follow up visit notes in {Patient Summary} in
 a new folder called <Newborn Screening>
- The NBS program is looking to identify locations for these children to schedule telehealth visits with their specialists, helping to cut down on travel, expenses, etc. For additional information, please contact Joyal Meyer at jbmeyer@nd.gov

Recommended Data Elements for Capture in the Master Patient Index (MPI)

Accurate patient identification is of the utmost importance in interoperability and failing to ensure accuracy poses a significant risk to patient safety and misidentification. Organizations have begun collaborating to provide guidance on several key components to reduce these risks.

The American Health Information Management Association (AHIMA) has released a
 Naming Policy to enhance patient matching and identification – the Naming Policy is
 attached to this email and you can find additional information by following the link

- Best practices related to naming conventions for accurate patient identification were developed by a workgroup of subject matter experts created by AHIMA and the Office of the National Coordinator for Health IT (ONC)
- The NDHIN team has begun brainstorming on ways that we could collaborate with others across the state to develop ND specific best practices and other helpful information – stay tuned for more to come on this!
